
The results below are the full responses from the evaluation survey of Jane-In participants from ALA Annual, June 2015.


I was a bit confused but I had great help at our table and gained a lot of information from the day.


I registered late, and I'm not sure I got the link to the tutorials. I need to go check, because I would like to look at them again.




They were very helpful. I appreciated the way that they interacted with each other to get the best responses to questions.


I didn't understand enough about the background or previous sessions.


Was too long. Would have preferred more rimmfing.


Removing MARC from the equation makes problems with RDA more obvious. When using MARC, catalogers can just keep doing what they've always done without having to acknowledge these mismatches.




